When we were approached by Diane Dimmer of Tacoma's Dimmer Family Foundation for a little assistance with the West Point Parents' Club dinner they were sponsoring in January 2017, we jumped at the chance to assist.

The dinner will commemorate the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. Diane's agenda includes a Hawaiian-themed dinner and entertainment, along with a panel discussion featuring four World War II volunteers: an Army Nurse, a Jewish Army Sergeant whose family escaped Hitler's Germany and who was among the first soldiers to enter Dachau, a B-17 navigator who was shot down over Yugoslavia and succeeded in returning to his unit, and a Navy radarman at the Battle of Leyte Gulf.

### **January: One Good Cause Supports Another**

The Pointe du Hoc Foundation sponsored two Ranger teams entered in the January 23rd, 2016 "Fight for Air" Stair Climb. This annual fundraiser, a race up Seattle's Rainier Tower, is sponsored by the American Lung Association. This was the second year that we sponsored 2d Ranger Battalion soldiers in this event.
